BLUEPRINT OF A STELLAR CRITIQUE

what to include and what to leave out of your next writing critique

- Basic Info: everything the writer needs to match your feedback to the right project and to reach out with questions.
- What Worked: it's just as important that the writer know what to keep doing as what to improve. So be generous with praise and kudos here, and note everything they did well.
- What to Work On: share what didn't work, but make sure you avoid critiquing anything that's based on your personal reading preferences. Point out issues like continuity errors, for example, but not the writer's genre choice. See the critique checklist for what to note and ignore in your critique.
- Suggested Resources: if you know of any great resources that might help the writer, share them.
- On-Page Notes: it's a good idea to highlight those great turns of phrase, funny moments, or awkward sentences in the story's pages.

Writing Gritique Checklist

BEST TO NOTE

- anything the writer specifically asks for feedback on
- show, don't tell issues
- character development
- plot holes
- continuity errors
- factual errors
- word choice errors
- lazy prose
- awkward phrasing
- structural issues
- lack of tension
- · scenes that fall flat
- pace & timing
- anything else that did or didn't work in the story

BEST TO IGNORE

- anything the writer asks you to overlook
- genre choices
- writing style
- POV choices
- 1st, 2nd, 3rd person narration choices
- voice & tone
- spelling
- grammar
- sentence structure choices
- theme choices
- language choices (like cursing or its lack)
- political opinion
- anything to do with your personal preference
